Equipment failure	If a boat is in poor repair or not set up properly spars and rigging could come lose injuring the occupant of the boat.  In some cases, it is also possible for the craft to sink i.e. bungs not in properly.  Breakages could cause injuries which need attending to. In some cases, the injury may cause the participant to struggle to return to the shore.	Regular seasonal equipment inspections are carried out and any faults are logged. Visual inspection to be carried out before every use.  Customers buoyancy aids/lifejackets checked by staff before going afloat. Staff to stay vigilant to customers fiddling with personal buoyancy.  Craft simplified, where appropriate, to reduce component failure risk.	

		RYA Safety boat qualified staff must be on site. Participants advised to stay in line of sight of the Activity Centre.  Participants should be aware of how to call for help if required (wave arms above your head and shout help).  Safety Boat should take participant back to shore or carry out first aid on the water as required. A first aid log entry must be completed for all first aid carried out.	
Capsize or Inversion	Capsize or inversion could lead to entrapment, hypothermia or drowning. Risk to all participants.	RYA Safety boat qualified staff must be on site. Participants advised to stay in line of sight of the Activity Centre.  Participants are briefed to stay with their boat or swim to shore if close. Raise the attention of the safety boat to come and assist righting, draining and helping them back into their boat.  Briefing includes customers to stay seated in their boats when underway (with the exception of paddle boards)  To hire a double handed dinghy users must be minimum adult L2 or stage 4. To hire single handed they must be minimum stage 3 or L1.  All customers must wear a PFD at all times (including SUP hire, leash must also be worn)  Access Pass holders launching their own SUP can chose either PFD or leash.	
Inappropriate craft users	Inadequate user capabilities / maturity to get the craft to go anywhere or stay safe.	Minimum age of 2+ subject to fitting in the smallest life jacket.	_

		Under 8's must be supervised by an adult on the water in the same boat on a ratio of 4:1  8-16 years old must be in sight of a guardian for the duration of the activity within a ratio of 6:1  16-18 year olds must provide parental permission and knowledge that their child will be unsupervised on the water before undertaking the activity. This can be done in person or by signing consent and emailing it to the activity centre office.	
Customers going out of sight of boat hire staff.	Customers at risk of becoming lost and unable to call for help.	Customers hiring boats to be logged on booking system. Details include number of participants, craft hired and time due back.  Participants advised to stay in line of sight of the Activity Centre and not to go beyond the island.	
Physical or verbal assault from members of the public or anglers	General insults or abuse could be shouted during the activity which may offend and be inappropriate in front of students.	Customers advised to keep away from occupied fishing pegs, other boats and customers.	
Poor Water quality (algal blooms)	All water users are at risk of sickness caused by certain algal blooms.	During period of algal blooms all participant and staff should be advised to consult a doctor if symptoms arise after contact with the water.  Everyone should be encouraged to wash hand and face before eating, after being on to the lake.	

		Water quality tested monthly from April to October and results made available if needed. Check against British Triathlon Levels.	
Manual Handling	When loading and unload the racks staff could lose footing and cause the equipment to fall onto them. Also, possible sprain or strain injuries from bad manual handling technique.	Senior Staff to ensure Staff are trained on correct procedures and ratios. Staff to wear closed-toe footwear with good grip whilst manoeuvring boats.  Staff to supervise participants when participants help.  Boat hire should ideally be run with two operatives on busy days. Minimum one person with someone else on site who can assist with heavy lifting at start and end of day and as needed.  Boat Hire container doors to be secured back to prevent crush injury.
